The comptroller has stated that under such circumstances, I "would not have a prohibited interest in the contracts between the School District and Port Jefferson Sporting Goods."

The comptroller has recommended that I make this entry in the minutes to "help maintain openness and public confidence in school districts," and I am glad to comply with that recommendation.
